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CSF Specimens on Suspect Creutzfeldt-Jakob Disease (CJD) Patients

Effective <u>July 14, 2025</u>, the instructions in the Lab Test Directory (LTD) will be updated for cerebrospinal fluid (CSF) specimens collected on patients with suspect Creutzfeldt-Jakob Disease (CJD), to align with the <u>Creutzfeldt-Jakob Disease Infection Control Policy</u> and <u>Clinical</u> Pathology Laboratory Specimen Handling and Precautions for Potential CJD Specimens.

Instructions for notification to the laboratory, labeling, double bagging, and transport have been included in the LTD <u>Creutzfeldt-Jakob Disease (CJD) Immunoassay.</u>

Instructions	 Notify the laboratory Specimen Processing that a suspect CJD specimen is being sent. Label each CSF specimen with the "Suspect CJD Patient" label. Inpatient Specimens: Contact laboratory Specimen Processing to request "Suspect CJD Patient" labels if needed.
	Suspect CJD Patient Double-bag the specimen with biohazard lab specimen bags. Do not transport through the tube system.
Laboratory Processing and Testing	Refer to the <u>Clinical Pathology Laboratory Specimen Handling and</u> <u>Precautions for Potential CJD Specimens</u> procedure for specimen handling.
