Thank you for your inquiry about the Corewell Health School of Medical Laboratory Science program!

This program is designed for interested post-baccalaureate candidates - non-MLS degree and MLS degree alike. Enthusiastic, self-directed students do very well in our program lecture series (weeks 1-25; full-time online & in-person) and clinical laboratory rotations (weeks 26-46; clinical sites full-time M-F). Upon successful completion of the program, graduates can receive a promising offer of employment under our tuition-free 2-year service commitment. Students who successfully complete the program are eligible to apply for the **Medical Laboratory Scientist** certification exam offered by the <u>American Society for Clinical Pathology</u> Board of Certification and seek employment in numerous clinical laboratory disciplines.

We are currently accepting applications for the January 2027 and July 2027 sessions as follows.

- Applications should be submitted by August 15, 2026.
- Interviews will be available July 15 through September 30, 2026.
- Students will be selected via the MTIMPM Matching Program.
- If you are interested <u>and</u> will meet the academic requirements <u>before</u> the program start date, we invite you submit **application documents** and **official transcript(s)**. See the program website below for more information.

ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS:

- U.S. equivalent of **B.S. degree** with:
 - A major in Biology, Microbiology, Chemistry, Biochemistry, Genetics, Molecular, or Medical Laboratory Science.
 - > A combination of 30 credit hours in biology and chemistry.
- GPA of 2.7 or higher and science grades of C+ (2.5) or higher to be verified by submitting official transcript(s) from all universities attended.
- Completion of the following <u>in-person</u> baccalaureate-level courses at a **U.S. academic institution within the last 7** years and before the program start date:
 - 1. INTRODUCTION TO CLINICAL LABORATORY SCIENCE proof of enrollment required at interview.
 - a. In-person college course with laboratory component.

 - o BLD 213L and 314L Michigan State University
 - Similar university/college course with laboratory component upon approval by program director.
 - 2. CHEMISTRY 16 credit hours including:
 - a. BIOCHEMISTRY (one course with passing grade with/without a laboratory component)
 - b. ORGANIC CHEMISTRY (at least one course with passing grade with/without laboratory)
 - 3. BIOLOGY 16 credit hours including:
 - a. GENERAL MICROBIOLOGY with laboratory and passing grade
 - 4. MATH (intermediate algebra or higher)
 - 5. PHYSIOLOGY (required) / ANATOMY (preferred)
 - a. Alternate: An online Human Anatomy & Physiology course upon approval by program director.
 - 6. **STATISTICS** (preferred)
- Additional skills: Microsoft Office Word, PowerPoint, Excel plus Internet/email applications
- Permanent U.S. resident or authorization to work in the U.S with Michigan residents given 1st priority.
- Previous work experience (required) with good letters of recommendation from faculty (1-2) and employer (1-2).
- Approval of the MLS Admission Committee to ensure GPA and university coursework meet both program admission requirements and certification agency requirements.
